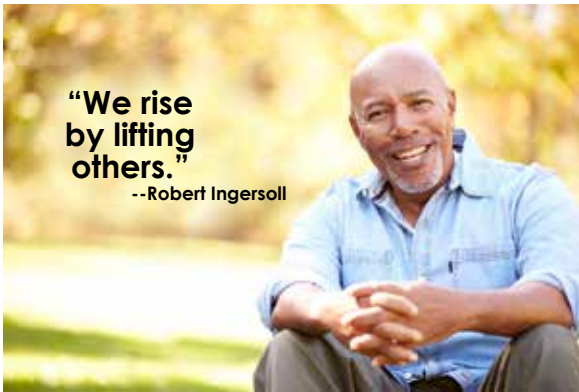

PATH (Projects for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness) is a program that aids individuals and families (age 18 and older) who are homeless, or at imminent risk of becoming homeless.

PATH programs provide community-based outreach, mental health,



substance abuse, case management and other support services to assist individuals with exiting homelessness through connecting with, and transitioning to, mainstream resources such as

income/benefits, housing, and long term mental health and substance abuse services.

CREOKS' PATH Case Management team have completed the SSI/SSDI Outreach, and Access and Recovery (SOAR) training which will assist PATH enrolled individuals with successful and timely access to benefits.

At CREOKS, we recognize that various life events can negatively impact an individual or family, but it doesn't have to define them.

Our PATH Case Management team provides intensive case management services to those enrolled in the PATH program. PATH participants are assisted with access to services, supports, and resources needed to transition from homelessness.

PATH Services Offered:

- Outreach, engagement, and intensive case management.
- Educate, refer and link individuals with existing and available community agencies and services, such as housing options, income benefits and employment supports.
- Collaboration with psychiatric inpatient and stabilization units, as well as area shelters.
- Individual counseling, psychiatric medication and medication management services.
